## All Chapter Meet – Report

The All Chapter Meet (ACM) of Nirmaan Organization was held on **7**<sup>th</sup> and **8**<sup>th</sup> of January 2017 at BITS Pilani, Hyderabad Campus!

Overall, a 100+ Nirmaan'ites participated in ACM.



In the two-day event, Nirman'ites from all the chapters participated in events ranging from informal chats, team lunches, and several fun games and external speakers, formal workshops and brainstorming sessions.

First day of ACM started with the inaugural session. Shri Venkat, AVP & CSR Lead from Synchrony Financial was the chief guest and gave his keynote address.
